Battle of Cowpens

Cowpens, South Carolina: Jan. 17, 1781:

At the Battle of Cowpens, Brig. General Daniel Morgan gave Andrew Pickens from South Carolina command of the militia, which played a key role in the battle. On the evening of January 16, Morgan personally instructed the militia to hold its ground while firing two rounds and then retreat. On the morning of January 17, Pickens and the militia carried out the plan perfectly, which led Lt. Colonel Banastre Tarleton and British to believe that the militia was fleeing. The British blindly charged ahead and were drawn into a double flanking and soundly defeated.





The flag flown during the battle became known as the Cowpens Flag.

Each year for the past 5 years, the Girl Scouts, as part of their annual Cookie Sale, have solicited sales for boxes of cookies to be sent to US Troops stationed overseas. Elizabeth's troop has led sales in Troop Cookies in each of the past five years with Elizabeth leading the sales within the Troop. This year, the Troop's goal is 500 boxes (last year they sold over 400). Elizabeth has sold over 100 boxes the last 3 years. The SAR has been responsible for purchasing between 50 and 60 each year. Last year the SAR purchased 61 boxes. At the 2012 Cowpens Reception, the SAR purchased 65.

Eagle Scout Information

Subject: Eagle Scout Recognition and Scholarship Program

This article is being written as a way to explain and promote the Eagle Scholarship program and lists some important dates that all SAR members should be aware of. Please pass these dates and information along to local SAR Chapters and to local Scout Councils - particularly to Scout Executives.

For many years the Sons of the American Revolution has recognized the common bonds of purpose and principles shared by the SAR and The Boy Scouts of America. Any Eagle Scout is eligible to apply for the scholarships who is still registered actively in a Scout unit, provided he does not reach his 19th birthday in the calendar year of application.

All Scout councils are urged to promote this program in several ways. These include: Staff Meetings, Executive Board Meetings, Council NESA committees, Council Newsletters, Advancement committees, Roundtables, Training Courses, Summer Camp, Eagle presentations and yearly Eagle Recognition Dinners.

It is worth noting that Robert E.Burt and Tom Burgess gave early leadership to this program for many years and established many of the procedures and awards.. They are retired professional scouters.

Important dates to remember each year:

Oct-Nov-Dec Applications due in local councils or By Jan 15th -Applications due in Local SAR Chapters By Feb 1st -Applications due in State Chairman's hand By Feb 15 - applications due in National Committees hand

At each level a judging committee may select a first, second, and third place winner to move forward to next level. Awards and recognition may be made at each level. Only the state winner is forwarded to the National Committee. Since the National Headquarters is in Louisville, Ky, information and applications should be easy to get. Local councils should keep literature and applications on hand in their Scout Shops.

Keep in mind that National Winners get an \$8,000, \$4,000 and \$2,000 scholarship. Feel free to write me at 1341 Copper Creek Dr. Lexington, Ky 40514-1271 or call me at 859-296-2303, if you have any questions.
