" 83, passed away at his home on Thanksgiving Day following a typically determined fight with cancer, providing a keenly appreciated new meaning to the holiday for

his family and friends who are deeply thankful for his remarkable life. He was born on a farm near Sulphur in Henry

County, KY, the only child of Oscar and Fannie Lee. After graduating as valedictorian of his high school class, he received both undergraduate and masters degrees in civil engineering from the University of Kentucky. He served as an officer in the U.S. Air Force from 1951 through 1954. His long and illustrious career in civil engineering included acting as Resident Engineer on the Watterson Expressway during the early years of its design and construction as well as what was then called the North-South Expressway, later part of Interstate 65.

In 1962, he was appointed County Engineer for Jefferson County and served in that capacity and that of Director of Public Works until 1969, when he became a principal at the design firm eventually known as Miller/Wihry/Lee, serving a variety of public and private clients throughout the U.S.

Throughout his life he displayed an untiring love of public and civic service, always striving to bring higher standards to the engineering profession, the political process, and a number of civic organizations. He served as president both of the Kentucky Society of Professional Engineers and the National Society of Professional Engineers, during which time he was active in governmental affairs and testified before Congress on behalf of the profession. He was chair of the Jefferson County Republican Party and continued to work diligently on behalf of the party, and was called upon by both the Democratic and Republican national committees for input into their campaign platforms during the presidential election of 1980.

He was a member of a dozen professional organizations and also served in leadership roles with the Jaycees, Lions, and the Louisville Chamber of Commerce. He was a thirtysecond-degree Mason, Louisville Lodge #400, Valley of Louisville Scottish Rite, Royal Order of Jesters Louisville Court 131, National Sojourners, Inc. Daniel Boone Chapter #512, a member of the Kosair Shrine Temple and served with the color guard for the Sons of the American Revolution.

An avid fan of his alma mater, he was a life member of the University of Kentucky Alumni Association and a UK Fellow, and was profoundly honored with a lifetime achievement award by the College of Engineering in 2001. He was a faithful member of Christ Church United Methodist, where he also served in a variety of leadership roles.

He is survived by his beloved wife of 60 years, the former Frances Farmer; his son, David Lee (Terrie); daughters, Cynthia Burgess (Dan) and Karen Vidal; grandsons, Eric Masters, M.D., Bryan Lee, Matthew Burgess (Arlyn) and Christopher Burgess (Ruthie); and great-granddaughter, Nancy Lee Burgess.
