National Awards

The <u>Liberty Bell Americanism Award</u> is presented to a chapter, based on size, which produces evidence of best implementing S.A.R. resolutions and principles. A chapter cannot win this award two years in a row, even if it has the most Americanism points. When this occurs, the chapter receives an Honorable Mention certificate.

Likewise, The <u>USS Stark Memorial Award</u> is presented to the chapter, based on size, with the best record of Service to Veterans during the year.

The Gov. Isaac Shelby and Simon Kenton Chapters are consistently leaders in their peer groups.



Free Flag Stand for Chapters

Another genealogical society has declared surplus the eight flag stands shown below. Dan Klinck, Louisville Thruston Chapter, would like to offer one of them to each of our chapters free. He asked that we promote this offer in our state newsletter. If they are not all disbursed, then a second offer will be made in a following newsletter and some chapters can have two. He would like to evenly disburse them.

These are used stands that cost \$40 new without shipping. They have the standard 1 ½" bore, weight six pounds and have a shiny gold finish. The cost of shipping will not exceed \$13 by the Postal Service to anywhere in Kentucky. The box will cost \$3 and if he sprays them gild, add \$1. Operation Ancestor Search Seeks State, Local Committee Members

Operation Ancestor Search (OAS) is a free NSSAR genealogy training program for Wounded Warriors and their families. It provides participants with the knowledge and tools that allow them to conduct their own genealogy research as they recover from their injuries at military hospitals and VA medical centers across the country.

The OAS program is conducted through SAR state societies and local affiliate chapters and their volunteer members. The national committee evolved from a local program developed at the former Walter Reed Army Medical Center (now the Walter Reed National Military Medical Center) by the DCSSAR. The program proved so successful that Ancestry.com became a major national sponsor, contributing a \$180,000 grant over three years, renewable for another three years after the initial period.

National Chairman Carl Bedell presides over the OAS Committee. Each State Society has its own OAS Chairman to spearhead these efforts and organize each state's program. State chairmen serve as ex officio members of the national committee.

State OAS Committee Members are volunteers who desire to share the genealogy expertise within the SAR in order to give back to the Wounded Warriors who were injured in their service to our nation. They provide injured service members with the knowledge and tools they need to conduct their own genealogy research in training classes, work sessions, individual hands-on assistance, and most notably, access to Ancestry.com databases.

OAS volunteers perform the following:


- 1. Help target the military medical facilities within their respective states that are most open and receptive to offering the OAS program to their Wounded Warriors.
- 2. Help identify the key personnel at those facilities and ensure that the facilities have adequate meeting space and computer facilities.
- 3. Help match the facilities with the leadership of the SAR local chapters in their closest geographic proximity in order to ensure adequate volunteer support.
- 4. Ensure that the state and local OAS committees are "visionary," meaning that they will not only serve the needs of the Wounded Warriors while they are inpatients, but that they will collaborate with local genealogical societies, lineage societies, libraries and other organizations as appropriate for support with training, reintegration and mentoring after they transition back to their local communities.
- 5. Ensure that the SAR's greatest resources our MEMBERS in local chapters across the country, in concert with our State and National Societies continue to develop Operation Ancestor Search as the preeminent SAR program, not only for us, but for our OAS partners who provide the resources that support our nation's Wounded Warriors and their families.


Dr. Thomas V. Getchell

Tom was a member of the Lafayette Chapter and recently volunteered to be involved with Kentucky's Operation Ancestor Search (OAS) which is mentioned on the preceding page. OAS is a free NSSAR genealogy training program for Wounded Warriors and their families.

Letters penned by Compatriot Getchell's great-grandfather during the Civil War inspired his interest in genealogy and the publication of Orrin's Story: Patriotism & Love of Country. The Union, Now and Forever. Based on his genealogical research, he had recently become a member of the Sons of the American Revolution.

Here is what Rick Kincaid, NSSAR's OAS Director had to say after hearing about Dr. Getchell 's death: Thanks so much for sharing the sad news! Needless to say, it hit me like a ton of bricks! I can't believe I never had the opportunity to meet Tom personally. As I mentioned at Saturday's meeting, he contacted me out of the clear blue a couple of days after the OAS article ran in last month's "Kentucky Pioneer" newsletter.

Tom said that he would like to become a "working member" of the OAS program and that he and his wife, Marilyn, would be "honored to work with our Wounded Warriors and SAR in this capacity." No one has ever voluntarily approached me before in such a genuinely gracious and sincere manner. As you know, I was looking forward to meeting Tom on Saturday and working with him to expand the program in Kentucky. He was a proud SAR member and proud of his genealogical research, and especially his recent book "Orrin's Story: Patriotism and Love of Country. The Union Now and Forever." Since that first medal, "Reggie" earned a bronze, silver and gold oak leaf cluster after accumulating over100,000 "Service to Veterans" points.

He was a regular at the Kentucky Derby parade and attended several Patriot Grave Marking services in Kentucky despite the fact that he lived in Missouri. "Reggie" was a very devout person so I know he has gone to a better place.
